We can explain the appearance of the WH form of the complementizer if we assume the WH-phrase stops in every Spec of CP position en route to the main clause Spec of CP position. Then the complementizer takes the WH form if it is in a complementizer that has hosted a WH-phrase at any stage in the derivation.
